### GENERAL NEWS

The final schedule has not been released yet, but I will pass it along as soon as it arrives. We are involved in the 4:00 p.m. concert on Sunday, March 29. Anyone is welcome to come and see our St. John's Band and Choir perform along with 9 other schools from the area. (Nine other schools perform in the 1:30 p.m. concert. All 19 schools will be there on Saturday!)

**Staying Healthy:** In wake of the attention given to COVID-19, please be advised that St. John's continues to encourage and use standard measures of preventing communicable disease. Please review and adhere to the following to help prevent the spread of illnesses:

Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially before eating and after going to the bathroom, blowing your nose, coughing or sneezing.

If you do not have soap and water, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol. Always wash hands with soap and water if hands are visibly dirty.

Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands.

Avoid close contact with people who are sick.

Stay home when you are sick. (St. John's policy: students must be fever free without medication for 24 hours and/or have not vomited within 24 hours)

Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash. Cough or sneeze into an elbow if no tissue is available. Wash your hands.

Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces frequently using a regular household disinfectant cleaning spray or wipe. (Our desks, tables, & learning surfaces are cleaned daily, as well as door handles.)
