Chapel Mission Offering: Students have recently cast their ballots for our chapel mission offering. Our mission offering this year has been designated for the WELS World Mission work in India. Home to over one billion people, India is the second largest country in the world with a great need of hearing the Gospel message of Jesus our Savior. WELS missionaries have been active in India since 1999 and have trained about 100 men to serve as pastors. Through the year we hope to learn more about the active mission work and pray and support this mission field. Each Friday for chapel, students are invited to bring a mission offering to school. Their offering can be placed in the offering plates by the door when they enter chapel.

Forensics: All competitive forensics events for this school year have been canceled. The teachers have determined that we still would like to help students develop their public speaking skills and that we will still hold our forensics event in a different format.
